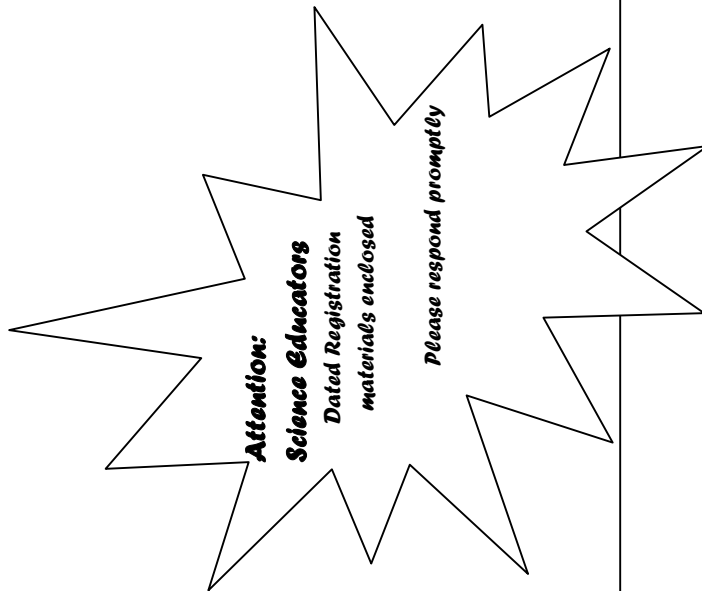

WORKSHOP SESSION: 5:00 – 6:00

A. EXPLORING WITH KID WIND Pat Madigan, Teacher, N. Syracuse HS
This workshop will touch on wind energy basics and on how to work with your students to design and build a wind turbine in preparation for a wind energy (blade) competition. Kid Wind integrates science concepts with inquiry and good old competition – a combination that results in high interest for your students.

The CNY Chapter of PIC works to enhance mountain gorilla conservation and humanitarian projects in Rwanda. Tim will share how PIC has made a difference in his life and that of his students.

C. EXPEDITION TO ANTARCTIA! Jeff Peneston, Teacher, Liverpool HS
Jeff was the PolarTREC teacher, chosen to work with an International team of scientists to explore the sea ice off the coast of Antarctica for two months aboard the Swedish icebreaker Oden. Jeff will tell about the trip, describe how classrooms can participate in ongoing polar science expeditions and how teachers can join teams of scientists in the field.
